



PROCEDURE FOR TAKING A CHECK

1. IS THE CHECK DATED TODAY?

- Postdated and checks given for return of, or replacement for, a previous check should not be accepted.

2. IS THE SIGNATURE LEGIBLE?

- The check should be signed in the presence of the person taking the check.
- Print the name of the signer of the check if the signature is illegible.

3. IS THE ADDRESS COMPLETE?

- There should be a permanent street address and home and work telephone numbers.

4. CAN YOU CONFIRM THE IDENTITY OF THE PERSON WHO SIGNED THE CHECK?

- If suspicious of a photo identification, examine it carefully. (ID can be easily forged.)

5. DOES THE AMOUNT OF THE CHECK IN NUMBERS MATCH THE AMOUNT OF THE CHECK IN WRITING?

6. RECORD THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION ON EACH CHECK:

- Driver's license number, even if preprinted on the check
- Date of birth
- Expiration date of the driver's license
- Initials of the person accepting the check

Recording of the information gives the DA the information he needs to file a case and obtain an arrest warrant for the check writer and, if the case is tried, the information helps to convince a judge or jury that the person who wrote the hot check is the person on trial.

CHECKS WE DO NOT ACCEPT

- post-dated checks
- stop-payment checks given only for services rendered
- checks under \$1,000 and more than one year old
- check given in return for another check
- checks where the merchant cannot provide the name of a witness
- check not presented to the bank for payment within thirty (30) days of the day it is written
- checks returned NSF where no certified notice has been sent unless the merchant is enrolled in the DA's fast Filing Program

SPECIAL NOTICE: If any check is more than \$1,000 and is otherwise of the type of check we do not accept, call one of the criminal investigators in the DA's Hot Check Division to discuss the merits of a potential case. If further investigation would be warranted, the investigator will set an appointment for you to come into the office with the check for possible action.
